



Introduction

The Alumni Center of Asheville City Schools was established in 2008 "to preserve history and to honor Graduates, Educators, Administrators and Friends of the Asheville City Schools since 1887." We are pleased to report on the activities of The Alumni Center for the period beginning January 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011.

The last formal report was provided to the Asheville City Board of Education on January 21, 2010 covering the activities since the opening of The Alumni Center in 2008. All of the activities and accomplishments have been facilitated by our volunteers, whose generous donations of time and skills we gratefully acknowledge. For ease of review, we have organized this report in a bullet-point format by topic.

Our main focus continues to be serving the Alumni of Asheville City Schools by assisting with class reunion events, developing and organizing historical information and the display of artifacts in the museum, communication of our existence and availability to our constituent populations, and seeking funding to continue these endeavors.

Reunions and Campus Tours

Perhaps the most interesting and enjoyable service provided by the Center is the hosting of reunion classes and campus tours. We observe the excited former students from many decades and generations as they are instantly transported back to their high days. The following classes held reunions during the reporting period (Classes graduating prior to 1970 are Lee Edwards High, classes graduating 1970 and after are Asheville High – same campus, different school name):

- Class of 1961 reunion and campus tour. (June 2011)

Donation of Artifacts

Communications

We have been working to assist interested parties and distribute information about the Center through several outlets, including the following:

- Produced a one-minute commercial about The Alumni Center for airing on Cougar Sports Network Broadcasts and on The Alumni Center Website.
- Reunion dates are continuously advertised on the AET Channel 16 Bulletin Board.
- Provided research assistance by telephone and on-site.
- Developed a partnership with Pack Memorial Library and the Old Buncombe County Genealogical Society for the sharing of research material.
- Website maintained and constantly updated by volunteer David Keyes ('73).

<u>Fundraising</u>

Funds are primarily provided by donations from classes conducting reunions and campus tours, and the sale of merchandise. Items such as T-shirts and sweatshirts are sold through the Gift Shop. A special school-year-end T-shirt sale was held during exam week (May 2011) for students, faculty and staff. All funds collected are deposited with the School Treasurer of Asheville High School (audited annually) and are used to purchase items such as paper, frames, office supplies and postage.

Digitizing of Yearbooks

The yearbook scanning process is up-to-date. Volunteer David Keyes ('73) scanned 116 yearbooks from 1915 to 2005, including 11,535 pages, from August 2009 through January 2011. These images were placed on The Alumni Center website for public access. The following schools were included: Asheville High/Lee Edwards, Stephens-Lee, South French Broad, David Millard, and Hall Fletcher. We do not have available all of the yearbooks from any of the schools except Asheville High/Lee Edwards.

Significant New Displays

In addition to adding donated artifacts to the museum area, we continue to update and expand our display offerings. Below are some of the new display items that have been added during the reporting period.

- Updated State Championship photos for Football 1922, Basketball 1955, Track and Field 2010 and Tennis 2010. (May 2010)
- Added several trophies and awards from the MCJROTC program. (June 2010)
- A major display honoring alumni who died in World War II was developed. (April 2011)
- Added physical display of extra copies of many yearbooks for hands-on research. (May 2011)
- Updated Athletic Record Book for research and display purposes. (June 2011)
- Added the late Robert P. Ingle ('52) to the "National Acclaim Wall of Fame." (June 2011)

Visitors and Meetings

The Alumni Center has become a popular place to visit for those interested in the history of the Asheville City Schools. Here are some of the groups we have hosted:

- Provided information and television interview area (WLOS TV-13) for Ken Michalove ('56) regarding death of former Asheville Mayor Dick Wood (Class of 1955) who was a high school cheerleader captain. (May 2011)


